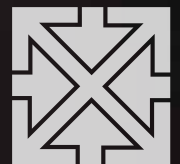
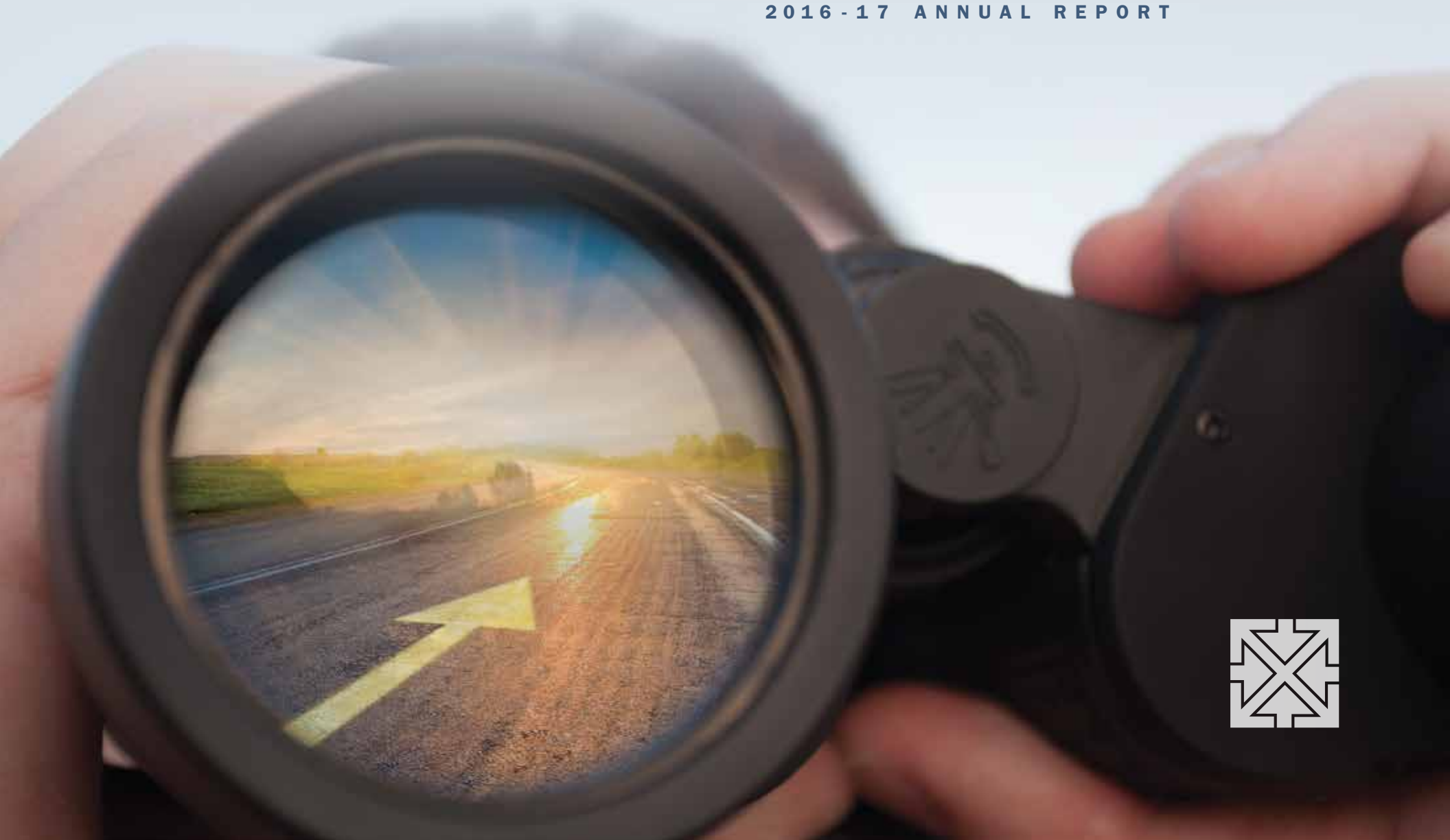

UNCOMPROMISED CUSTOMER SERVICE HAS DEFINED HCSC SINCE ITS INCEPTION and remains as the foundation of our daily approach to the business. Customer Focus is one of our four Core Values along with Trust, Integrity and Passion. It is an attitude, as Mo Hardy states, and a trait that our employees embrace and take pride in demonstrating. Every day, each division performs customer service surveys among our client segments to ensure we are meeting their needs and delivering on that core value. As the healthcare industry has continued to undergo massive changes at a high rate of speed, we must keep pace and respond to the ever-evolving needs of our stakeholders with relentless customer service. Whether the HCSC team is responding to a critical need, helping to solve a business problem or ensuring a patient's comfort or care, customer focus remains a top priority.

Customer service can also be measured in customer retention and growth. Originally serving 10 regional hospitals, HCSC now successfully supports more than 1,000 healthcare facilities in the Mid-Atlantic region. Corporate revenues grew by 5% this year as a result of several new hospital customers and the expansion of the Ambulatory Care business.

In September, our Linen Services division successfully completed the expansion and automation of our Allentown processing facility, while our Ambulatory Care division continued to grow at a rapid pace, now servicing more than 900 locations. The Miller-Keystone Blood Center division continued to maintain a safe and continuous flow of blood products and services to 22 area hospitals, as St. Luke's-Monroe Campus became its newest customer. The blood center operates under the rigorous FDA regulatory guidelines and also began testing the blood supply for Zika virus in November.

In addition to the services we provide to our customers, HCSC also remains committed to the communities that we serve. This past year, scholarships were presented to 32 well-deserving regional high school students who demonstrated outstanding leadership in coordinating blood drives. Grants were also awarded to numerous regional nonprofit organizations including the Allentown Rescue Mission, Cancer Support Community of the Lehigh Valley, Cedar Crest College "Partners in Nursing" Program, Children's Home of Easton, Fund to Benefit Children & Youth, the Hillside School, Lehigh Valley Children's Centers, LifePath, Mercy Center for Special Learning, Project Child, Second Harvest Food Bank and Weller Health Education Center. Each was in support of the advancement of healthcare and educational initiatives.

It was Henry Ford who said, "Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is success." HCSC was founded through the collaboration and commitment of healthcare organizations here in the region. Our stakeholders have grown in number and across a larger geographic community, making the core value of Customer Focus even more critical for sustaining success. Thanks to the support and the collaboration of our customers, employees, volunteers and board of directors, we can continue to deliver programs and services that enhance the patient experience and improve the quality of care right here in our communities.

HEALTHCARE LINEN SERVICES

FOR MORE THAN 40 YEARS, THE HCSC-LAUNDRY AND LINEN SERVICES DIVISION has diligently worked to earn an industry-leading reputation for customer service, while also providing high-quality, cost-efficient products and services. We believe this focus has led to our strong retention and growth metrics, as this year, 10 agreements totaling 184 existing accounts were renewed, while we also welcomed 11 new acute care, long-term care and rehabilitation facilities.

Over the past year, the expansion and modernization of our Allentown textile processing plant was completed, adding more than 20 million pounds of capacity and a state-of-the-art sortation and washroom that has dramatically improved the plant's overall efficiency. Repairs, remodeling and new security measures were also implemented in the existing building, enabling HCSC to complete all the planned transfers, while installing several new customers including Reading Health System, Cedarbrook Nursing Homes and Thomas Jefferson University Hospital.

Four of HCSC's Laundry facilities were also re-accredited with the Healthcare Linen Accreditation Council (HLAC).

Additions to HCSC's hospital product offerings included patient safety, falls prevention gowns, behavioral health gowns, behavioral health pajama pants and three-arm-hole precaution gowns, all made available for caregiver compliance.

The growth of our Ambulatory Care Services division continued at a rapid pace as it entered its third full year of

operation. The white-glove delivery service offers a full array of products to outpatient settings enhanced with personalized inventory control and cost-management programs. The division added 309 accounts during the fiscal year and has now grown to serve more than 900 accounts on 11 routes. This year, a mobile delivery system was also implemented, providing real-time, digital management of routing, delivery and inventory. New products were added to the line, including privacy curtain processing, microfiber dust control products and enhanced lab coat offerings.

HCSC remains committed to taking a leadership role in preserving our environment and reducing the waste stream. This past year, our Laundry plants recycled 571,907 pounds of plastic, 89,726 pounds of cardboard and 3,034 pounds of paper. Operational initiatives such as our Cart Chipping pilot and Garment Scanner System upgrade were integrated with cost-management initiatives and ongoing efforts to combat linen loss and lower production expenses. In addition, several online updates were completed to provide customers with increased stability and faster transaction times.

We continued to maintain a focus on the energy markets as prices for crude oil, diesel fuel and regular gasoline increased during the course of the fiscal year, while residential electric costs also rose, as anticipated. The cost of linen decreased early in the year, while the price of cotton began to steadily climb, with a 22% increase from 2015 and 15% from 2016. As a result, linen costs are expected to rise in the coming year.

FOR MORE THAN 40 YEARS, MILLER-KEYSTONE BLOOD CENTER HAS BEEN RECOGNIZED as one of the nation's leading and most experienced blood centers. Every day, our professional staff demonstrates their commitment to all the stakeholders in our community, enabling the Blood Center to sustain its mission by providing a safe and continuous flow of blood products and services to the region's hospitals.

That commitment begins with our dedicated donor base and ensuring the environment in which they donate meets every regulatory requirement and provides the most positive customer service experience. It continues with the local organizations that conduct more than 2,000 blood drives each year and give back to the Blood Center in so many

ways. And that commitment also includes the 22 hospitals that we service in the region, including the new St. Luke's University Health Network Monroe Campus, which joined our blood services program in October. Our reach also extends beyond our service area, as we have also assisted our neighboring blood centers in New Jersey and Pennsylvania by leveraging the depth of our talent with resource-sharing relationships.

MKBC was also active on the national level this past year as Medical Director D. Kip Kuttner, D.O., presented at meetings held by America's Blood Centers and the New Jersey Association of Blood Bank Professionals. In addition, we collaborated with Lehigh Valley Hospital and Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center on two AABB presentations at

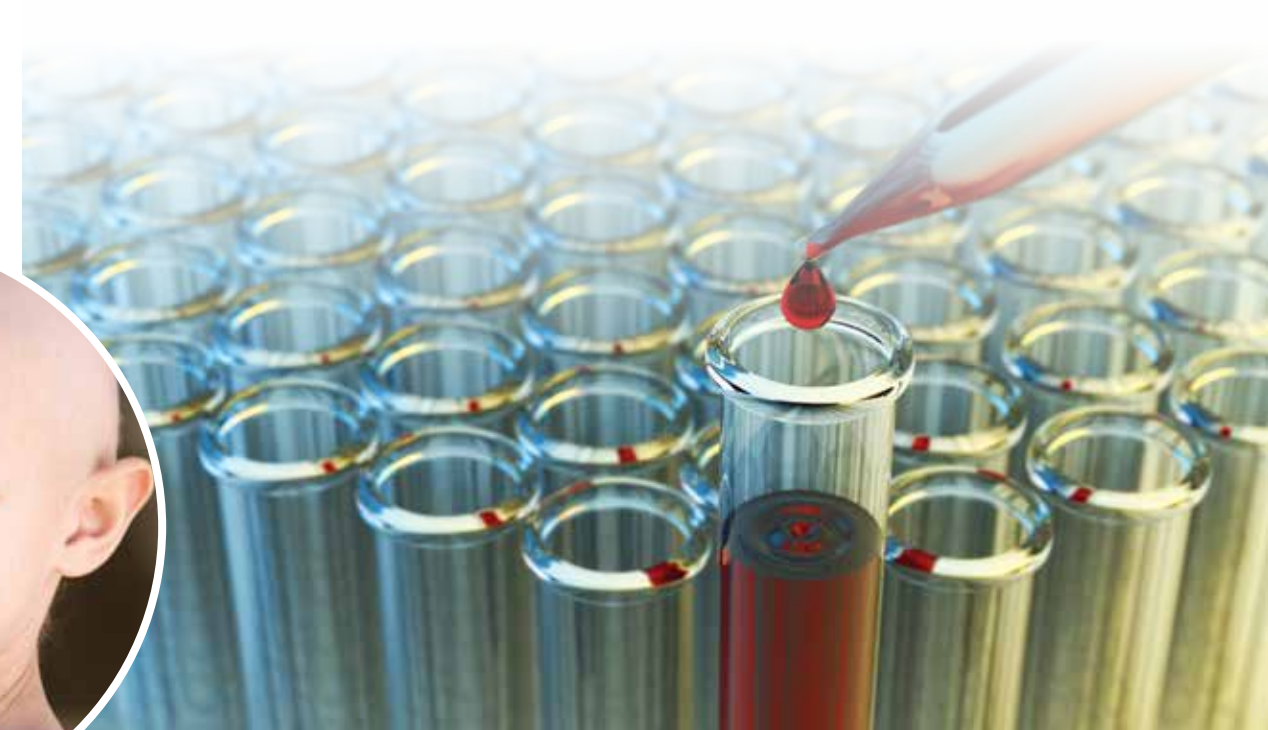
their annual meeting, featuring the identification of a rare blood group antibody.

Our number one priority is to ensure we are in compliance with FDA and other regulatory requirements. In November, the Blood Center completed the implementation of Zika testing on all blood products, in accordance with FDA guidelines. Our technical team also continued to educate our hospital customers on ways to manage the proposed FDA guidance on decreasing bacterial contamination of single-donor platelets, while also improving the product expiration rates for our hospitals.

In order to meet the needs of our hospital customers while maintaining a competitive cost position, the Blood Center invested in several critical information technology projects and solutions. The year began with the installation of the Vista project, designed to automate blood-loss tracking by reducing human error and product attrition, while also improving access to reporting.

Our IT team also completed the development of a Data Warehouse that will provide critical information across all our operations, including inventory, donor processing and financial data. The Data Warehouse will enable our management team to drill down on performance data and make faster and better decisions for the business. Finally, as the year drew to a close, after an extensive and comprehensive evaluation, a new BECS (Blood Enterprise Computer System) was selected with implementation planned for completion in the new fiscal year.

The region's businesses, schools, community and faith-based organizations continue to provide outstanding leadership in assisting in our blood-collection goals. Our Local Leaders initiative has historically recognized those organizations that collect more than 200 units of blood annually. In 2016, 18 Local Leaders organizations eclipsed

that threshold and also contributed an amazing 31% increase in their blood collections year over year. In a show of appreciation, our Local Leaders were presented with a plaque, photographed and featured on our website and social media.

Anticipated fluctuations in inventory over the summer and winter months were offset through increased donor engagement through a series of promotional events and donor-recruitment initiatives driven by our social media platforms. The response from the community was outstanding as usual at these events, including our Heroes Blood Drive Challenge competition among regional Fire, Police and EMS personnel, the Angela Hohl Memorial Blood Drive and the Lehigh Valley Phantoms' Bleed Orange Blood Drive.

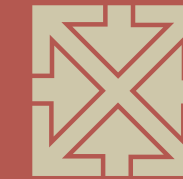
